Achieving universal access to diagnostics requires healthcare services to reach people where they are. The COVID-19 response injected new urgency into decentralized testing, with health systems across the world rapidly rolling out innovations to bring testing as close to people as possible.

Data-driven design, implementation, and evaluation of people-centred models of care are key to health systems' resilience. Digital tools can support this by enabling rapid, efficient data management to guide decision-making, facilitating follow-up and linkages, and providing health workers and patients with critical health information needed to ensure quality services.
